Section V: Report of Progress Narrative

For the 2022-2023 school year, we are pleased with our academic performance. Our students in grades K - 3 continue to show great growth and performance on the Idaho Reading Indicator. Using our benchmark data from i-Ready allows us to monitor the performance and growth of our students in grades K - 11 in both reading and math. This comprehensive data allows us to review our full academic program over time, making the necessary changes to enhance our academic achievement. Our high school consistently achieves a graduation rate above 90%. We require all juniors to take the SAT each spring. While the achievement on this test is lower than we would like, we continue to look at how to increase this area. At least 65% of our students demonstrated typical growth in both math and reading. This is an area we will focus on for the 2023-2024 school year, as we have set our goal at 75% in both math and reading. We continue to offer many dual credit courses in our high school. We have seen an increase in the number of students participating in our CTE programs. We will continue to strive at providing these opportunities for our students.
