Section V: Report of Progress Narrative

For the 2023-2024 school year, we are pleased with our academic performance. Our students in grades K-3 continue to impress us with their growth from Fall to Spring on the Idaho Reading Indicator. We fell a little short of our goals to have 90% of our students reading at grade level on the IRI. However, all grade levels were at least at 79% scoring proficient. We continue to use the iReady diagnostic assessment in reading and math three times per year for all students grades K-11. This benchmark data allows us to monitor the performance and growth of our students. This comprehensive data allows us to review our full academic program over time, making the necessary changes to enhance our academic achievement.. Our high school consistently achieves a graduation rate above 90%. We require all juniors to take the SAT each spring. While the achievement on this test is lower than we like, we are seeing small growth each year. In 2022-2023 65% of our students met the typical growth on both reading and math on the iReady diagnostic, this year that increased to 67%. We will continue our focus on providing individualized intervention to increase the growth in both of those areas. We continue to provide multiple opportunities for students to earn dual credit from teachers at Melba High School. We also have a great number of students who take advantage of dual credit opportunities through IDLA. We have also seen an increase in the number of students taking CTE courses and programs.
