Section V: Report of Progress Narrative

We remain pleased with our academic progress, however, there are always areas that we would like to improve. During the 24-25 school year our K-3 students performed very well on the Spring IRI. Second grade was lower than we would like but still achieved 73% proficiency. We continue to use the iReady diagnostic assessment in grades K-11 in both reading and math three times per year. This benchmark data allows us to monitor the performance and growth of our students. This comprehensive data allows us to review our full academic program over time, making the necessary changes to enhance our academic achievement. During the 24-25 school year we saw 70% of our students meet their typical growth in Reading and Math on the iReady assessment. This was an increase from 67% the previous year. We will continue our focus on providing individualized intervention to increase the growth in both of those areas. Our high school consistently achieves a high school graduation rate above 90%. We require all juniors to take the SAT each spring. While the achievement on this test is lower than we like, we will continue to work with our juniors to increase their performance. We continue to provide multiple opportunities for students to earn dual credit from teachers at Melba High School. We also have a number of students who take advantage of dual credit opportunities through IDLA. We had 2 seniors graduate from Melba High School with an Associate Degree from BSU in 2025-2026. We have also seen an increase in the number of students taking CTE courses and programs.
